Background

- Scholarly activity is increasingly a core function for most faculty at institutions of higher learning.
 Scholarship can facilitate career development and promotion.
- Recent reports: scholarship within the PA profession has lagged behind that of other professions.
- There is a need for a comprehensive understanding of scholarly activities, and to innovate new ways to promote scholarship

Background

- The ability to balance teaching, scholarship and service is a daunting task in PA education.
- PA educators need practical and effective strategies.
- Participants will explore practical and effective methods of promoting and assessing scholarly efforts.
- The session will focus on solutions that do not require substantial faculty expertise or funding, and those that can be implemented easily in PA programs.

 - definition and examples of scholarly activities,
 - barriers and how to overcome them,
 - resources to facilitate scholarly activities,
 - the role of mentorship,
 - how to establish a research infrastructure in a PA program.
